

The Right Reverend Dr. Silvester Scott Beaman

THE REVEREND DR. SILVESTER SCOTT BEAMAN is a native of Niagara Falls, New York. He is a B.S. graduate of Wilberforce University and a Master of Divinity graduate of Boston University. He was awarded the Doctor of Divinity Degree for Meritorious Achievement in Christian Ministry and Public Service by Richard Wright Theological Seminary in Evanston, South Africa. In June 2012, he was the first to receive a Doctor of Ministry degree from Payne Theological Seminary, Wilberforce, Ohio, and Bakke Graduate University, Seattle, Washington joint seminary program.

Dr. Beaman's pastoral career began at Bethel A.M.E. Church in Lackawanna, New York, in 1985. In 1986, he was appointed to the historic St. Paul A.M.E. Church in Hamilton, Bermuda. During his administration at St. Paul, the church's 1.3-million-dollar debt was reduced significantly, new ministries were created, youth programming was further developed and the Fairhaven Christian Drug Rehabilitation live-in program for women was built. On May 30, 1993, he was appointed to Bethel A.M.E. Church in Wilmington, Delaware. Since that time, he has taken in over 2,700 new members.



Under his administration, extensive renovations to the church were completed including, sanctuary technology which was upgraded as part of a

\$500,000 renovation program. Over 50 new ministries, such as the AIDS Task Force, men's & women's ministries, mentoring programs for youth, senior citizen ministries, youth suicide crisis prevention, and a community evangelism outreach program were established. Since 2001, the Beautiful Gate Outreach Center, a full-service HIV/AIDS testing, medical, outreach, and educational program, has been serving the community, assisting thousands of Delawareans annually on the site of Bethel.

Dr. Beaman has served as the Director on numerous community and national boards, organizations, governmental task forces, and commissions. He is the past President of the Interdenominational Ministerial Action Council of Wilmington, Delaware. He has been inducted into the Martin Luther King, Jr. Board of Preachers at Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia. He is also a member of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity and Prince Hall Mason Star of the East Lodge #1. During his farewell as the Pastor of Bethel AME Church, Wilmington, Delaware, Governor John Carney awarded Dr. Beaman with the highest honor as a Delaware citizen, with the "First Order of the State Award." He is one of a few clergy persons in the nation who has offered prayer in the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives.

Dr. Beaman was honored to be asked by President Joseph Biden to offer the benediction at the January 20, 2021, Presidential Inauguration of Joseph R. Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris. The Beaman and Biden families have been friends for close to thirty years.

On July 11, 2021, during the General Conference, Dr. Beaman was elected and consecrated as the 139th Bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church in Orlando, Florida. He has been assigned to serve the 15th AME Episcopal District (Namibia, Angola, Boland, Eastern Cape, Queenstown, Cape, and Kalahari Annual Conferences) of South Africa.


On September 26, 2023, President Biden announced the establishment of a 12-member President's Advisory Council on African Diaspora Engagement in the United States and named Bishop Beaman as the Council Chair.

He is married to his childhood sweetheart and best friend, Renée Palmore Beaman, RN. Renée currently serves as the Governor-appointed Director of the Delaware Division of State Service Centers, which oversees Delaware's fifteen State Service Centers, the State Office of Volunteerism, and the Office of Community Services. They are the blessed parents of two adult daughters, Asaiah (Gregory Fisher) and Kori (Walter Cheatham), and four grandchildren, Maliah, Gabriella, Gregory Mason, and Kai.

Presiding Elder Truman Tolefree

THE REVEREND TRUMAN TOLEFREE was born and raised in Warren, Arkansas. He is the youngest of 11 children born to Howard and Annie Mae Tolefree

Upon graduation from college, Rev. Tolefree was employed as a schoolteacher in the Eudora. Arkansas Special School District from 1972-1973. In 1973, he married his childhood sweetheart, the former Bettie Ann Davis, also of Warren. In 1975, he was employed by the City of Little Rock Parks and Recreation Department, where he worked his way up through the ranks to the position of Assistant Director. In 1990, Rev. Tolefree answered the call to ministry as a preacher of the Gospel of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. In 1993 he was ordained an Itinerant Deacon in the African Methodist Episcopal Church and in 1995 he was ordained an Itinerant Elder. From 1992 – 1995, he served as the pastor of Sherman Chapel AME Church (Keo, Arkansas.) and St Luke AME Church (Hensley, Arkansas). Tolefree left Little Rock in 1995 and moved to Atlanta, Georgia to enroll at the Interdenominational Theological Center (ITC) to pursue a Master of Divinity Degree and also serve as the Deputy Director of the City of Atlanta 's Bureau of Recreation. In 2000, he was named Director of the City of Atlanta Bureau of Recreation. While in Atlanta, he joined St. Philip AME Church under the pastorate of Reverend George Moore. In 2000, he received his Broadcast and Air shifter Certification and went on to serve as the onair broadcaster for the "Good Time Gospel Hour" radio program which aired on WRFG 89.3 FM, until his return to Little Rock.



In April of 2006, Tolefree returned home to Little Rock, Arkansas to serve as the Director of Little Rock's Parks and Recreation Department where he was responsible for the management and oversight of more than 300 full and part time employees with an annual operating budget of 13 million dollars and a 17-million-dollar capital improvement budget. In 2008, Rev. Tolefree was appointed pastor of the Rison Circuit where he served for three years as pastor of St. James AME Church (Rison, Arkansas) and Bethel AME Church (Fordyce, Arkansas). In 2011, he was appointed the pastor of Bethel AME Church (Bigelow, Arkansas), where he was blessed by God to be able to construct a completely new worship facility from the ground up. In 2015, Rev. Tolefree was appointed as pastor of the Pilgrim Rest A.M.E. Church in Monticello, Arkansas. Rev. Tolefree retired from the City of Little Rock in June 2017. In November of 2017, he was appointed pastor of Bethel A.M.E. Church, Little Rock, Arkansas, and in February 2022, he was appointed Presiding Elder of the Arkansas Annual Conference Little Rock District.

Rev. Tolefree graduated from Bradley County High School and later matriculated at the University of Arkansas at Monticello, where he graduated in 1971 with a Bachelor of Science in Education Degree.

Rev. Tolefree is a graduate of North Carolina State University Revenue Sources Management School. He is a graduate of Leadership Greater Little Rock, and a member of the National Recreation and Parks Association, Arkansas Recreation and Parks Association and the National Forum for Black Public Administrators. Tolefree is an NRPA professional who has served on several municipal, state and national committees and panels that have helped to create and implement national Parks and Recreation industry standards and best practices. He has received several awards, commendations and formerly served as a member on the Governor's Commission on Outdoor Recreation

Rev. Tolefree's favorite scripture is Ephesians 6:12. His highest priority in life: To preach and teach the Gospel of His Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. His highest objective: To live the abundant life of the Kingdom of God. His favorite hobbies are writing and playing guitar. In 1985, he wrote and recorded the song "Arkansas Will Always Be My Home" in honor of Arkansas's Sesquicentennial celebration (150 years of statehood).

Reverends Truman and Bettie (who currently serves as the pastor of Quinn Chapel AMEC, Little Rock, Ar.) have been married for 50 years and currently reside in Little Rock, Arkansas. They have two grown children, Shannon Dionne, (Houston, Texas) and Truman Nicholas (Erin) (Rochester, New York). Four wonderful grandsons: Jordan, Chase, (Atlanta, Ga.) Truman Eric, and Nicholas Alexander (New York), and one beautiful, adorable granddaughter, Claire Marie. His grandchildren affectionately refer to him as "DeeDa".

The Reverend Charlene N. Boone

Reverend Charlene N. Boone was born and reared in Harford County, Maryland to the late Charlie and Thelma Smith. Reverend Charlene has two adult children: Taryn C. Boone and Dr. Kyle N. Boone (Aisha). She is the proud (YaYa) grandmother of Kyrynn Nicea and Riley Nasir. Reverend Charlene's Fur baby is Jynjer Snap. She is a graduate of Hampton University, Hampton, Virginia; Bowie State University, Bowie, Maryland; St. Mary's Seminary, Baltimore, Maryland and Lee University, Cleveland, Tennessee. Reverend Charlene is currently a DMin candidate in Spiritual Formation at Liberty University, Lynchburg, VA.

Reverend Charlene was licensed to preach in February 1983 at St. James A.M.E. Church, Havre de Grace, Maryland. She was ordained an Itinerant Deacon in 1986 at the Baltimore Annual Conference by Bishop John Hurst Adams and ordained an Itinerant Elder in 1988 at the East Tennessee Annual Conference by Bishop Cornelius E. Thomas.



Reverend Charlene began her pastoral career in 1986, serving A.M.E. churches in Tennessee and Kentucky. She was appointed by Bishop H. Hartford Brookins to Historic Warren Chapel in Chattanooga, Tennessee in 1998. According to the A.M.E. Historiographer, Dr. Dennis Dickerson, Reverend Boone became the first woman to Pastor a 1st church in the Annual Conference Connection. In 2014, she transferred to the 12th Episcopal District by Bishop Samuel L. Green and was assigned to Greater Ward Chapel A.M.E. Church in Pine Bluff, Arkansas. In 2017, Bishop Michael Mitchell transferred and appointed Reverend Charlene to the Historic Visitors Chapel, Hot Springs, AR.

She has served as a delegate to the General Conference since 1996. Previously, Reverend Charlene has had the honor of being Chair/Dean of the Board of Examiners and currently serves as the Chair of the Board of Examiners for the 12th Episcopal District.

She also has served as a member of the Annual Conference Trustee Board, former President of Women in Ministry, 13th District, and former Treasurer of the Annual Conference, 13th Episcopal District. Under the tutelage of Dr. George Champion, she was a Regional Director and subsequent Dean of the Department of Worship and Evangelism of the A.M.E. Church under Dr. James Wade. She has had the honor of preaching and teaching in various venues throughout the United States.

Reverend Charlene is a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated, the NAACP, Hot Springs Agape Ministerial Alliance, and the Hot Springs Clergy Fellowship. She has served as an Adjunct-Instructor at Lee University, Cleveland, Tennessee, where she taught Old and New Testament Studies and Christian Thought, being the first African American female to teach in the Biblical studies department. She currently serves as an Instructor and Coordinator for the BA Completion program at Jackson Theological Seminary in North Little Rock, Arkansas.

Reverend Charlene loves to cook, make jewelry, read, and study the Word of God. She believes God is able to do way more that we can ask or think if we continually look to the hills from where our "Help Comes From." Habakkuk 3:19 says the LORD God *is* my strength, and he will make my feet like hinds' *feet*, and he will make me to walk upon my high places." is her motivational scripture for the past 40 years of ministry.
