PRESIDING PRELATE OF THE TWELFTH EPISCOPAL DISTRICT African Methodist Episcopal Church

The hand of God has been evident on the life of **Bishop Michael Leon Mitchell** since he was a young child. Born August 4, 1960, in Perry, Florida to the late Reverend Arthur L. Mitchell, Sr. and the late Mrs. Mary L. Mitchell, Michael is the ninth of their fifteen children.

Bishop Mitchell, a life-long member of the African Methodist Episcopal Church, was raised in Jacksonville, Florida, and is a product of Duval County Public Schools. While in high school, he answered the call to the ministry and preached his trial sermon at age 17, on August 28, 1977 at New Saint James AME Church. Determined to achieve God's purpose for his life, Bishop Mitchell began his ministerial training, studying under the African Methodist Episcopal Church and was ordained an Itinerant Deacon in 1979 and an Itinerant Elder in 1981. His first pastoral assignment came in 1985 at the A.M.E. Church of the Master (Jacksonville, FL). He also pastored Mount Zion (Arcadia, FL), Saint Luke (Tampa, FL), Martin Memorial (Miami, FL), and 24 years at Saint Stephen (Jacksonville, FL).

Bishop Mitchell graduated from Wilberforce University, Wilberforce, Ohio in 1982 and received a Master of Divinity Degree from Turner Theological Seminary at the Interdenominational Theological Center, Atlanta, Georgia in 1986. He received a Doctor of Ministry Degree from United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio in 2012.

Bishop Mitchell is married to Supervisor Cordelia D. Mitchell and they have two daughters, Courtney and Channing. Upon his election and consecration as the 134th Bishop of the AME Church in 2016, they were blessed to be assigned as the Episcopal Leaders of the 12th Episcopal District of the AME Church, comprising the states of Arkansas and Oklahoma. Among many other accomplishments since his arrival, Bishop Mitchell rendered direction to the leadership of the District to complete projects begun by his predecessors. The mortgage of the Episcopal Residence was liquidated, and construction of the 12th Episcopal District Headquarters (which also houses Jackson Theological Seminary) was completed within two years of his arrival, and that mortgage liquidated in 2022.

Bishop Mitchell presently serves as the Chair of the Global Witness and Ministry Commission of the AME Church, Chair of the Boards of Trustees of Shorter College and Jackson Theological Seminary, and First Vice Chair of the Turner Theological Seminary Board of Trustees.

A true servant leader, Bishop Mitchell possesses a heart for the parish and the people, a mind for productivity and progression of God's plan, and the spirit to powerfully proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ.

The Reverend Dr. Daniel W. Johnson

Reverend Dr. Daniel W. Johnson is the last child of four to Mrs. Aline (Watson) and Mr. Benjamin F. Johnson of Camden, Arkansas.

Reverend Dr. Johnson is a 1979 graduate of Camden High School, Camden, AR; a 1983 graduate of Southern Arkansas University, Magnolia, AR, Bachelor of Arts, Political Science; a December 1984 Graduate of Arkansas State University, Jonesboro, AR, Master of Public Administration; a 1998 graduate of the United States Army Command and General Staff College; a 2009 graduate of Turner Theological Seminary, at the Interdenominational Theological Center, Atlanta, GA, Master of Divinity; and a 2019 graduate of the United Theological Seminary, Dayton, OH, Doctor of Ministry.



Reverend Dr. Johnson is a retired United States Army, Air and Missile Defense Officer, where he served twenty-one years of active military service from May 1985 until May 2006. He served in educational roles in the military as a Company and Battalion Tactical Officer at the United States Military Academy at West Point, NY from 1993 – 1996, and as the Professor of Military Science at Grambling State University, Grambling, LA from 2000-2004.

Reverend Dr. Johnson was licensed to preach in the African Methodist Episcopal (A.M.E.) Church March 2006 in the Atlanta North Georgia Annual Conference, 6th Episcopal District. He was ordained an Itinerant Deacon, May 2009, and ordained Itinerant Elder May 2011. He served as Pastor at Belvin A.M.E. Church in Marshallville, GA, from May 2011 – April 2015, in the Macon Georgia Annual Conference. He also served as a member of the Macon Conference Board of Examiners, and as the South Macon District Christian Education Director.

Reverend Dr. Johnson, on April 11, 2015, was transferred to the East Arkansas Annual Conference of 12th Episcopal District, to the current pastoral charge of Allen Temple A.M.E. Church – Pine Bluff, AR. He serves as East Arkansas Conference Sons of Allen Coordinator, and as Chair of the East Arkansas Conference Board of Examiners.

Reverend Dr. Johnson served as the Bachelor of Arts, Full-time instructor from 2019 -2020, and the Master of Divinity Full-time Faculty instructor for Jackson Theology Seminary, North Little Rock, AR, from 2020 – 2022. Reverend Dr. Johnson is the current Coordinator of the Christian Leadership Program at Shorter College since July 2021 to present.

Reverend Dr. Johnson is married the former Ms. Janet D. Coleman, of Bearden, AR. They have three children: Mrs. Kristen (Kay Dene') Carr (SGT William Carr, USA), 1Lt Judith Johnson, USAF, and Daniel Johnson, II, UAPB Class of 2022 Graduate.

Reverend Dr. Johnson is a life member of Kappa Alpha Psi, Fraternity Inc.

The Reverend Cheryle R. Highsmith

Cheryle S. Highsmith, a native of Fordyce, Arkansas, was reared in a loving, nurturing and God-fearing environment, by her parent(s) the late Lee (Big Red) and Mamie Thrower. She was taught the scriptures at an early age and knew that Jesus loved her. At the age of five, she was baptized by the late Rev. George Smith at St. John Fordyce. She was active in the Sunday School, Youth Choir and YPD. As she matured in the body of Christ, she became a Sunday School teacher, secretary, assistance superintendent, YPD director, stewardess, steward, hospitality chairperson and a member of the Inspirational Choir. She was later appointed Area II YPD director of the Pine Bluff South District.



Little did she know when she and her sisters were playing church at home, that God had a calling upon her life, In January of 1992, she delivered her first missionary address, afraid of what family would say, if she announced she was called to preach. However, after been slain in The Spirit on numerous occasions, The Lord let her know exactly where her position was in the body of Christ. In 1993, she answered the call to preach The Gospel of Jesus Christ, under of the pastorate of the late Rev. Frank R. Williams. Cheryle was licensed to preach by the late Rev. William "Jim" Hunter and ordained by The Right Reverend Fredrick H. Talbot. For five years she co-pastored with her spouse, the late Rev. James E. Highsmith. However, after a recommendation by Elder Hunter, she was assigned to Bethel Ladd in March 1997. Rev. Cheryle served ten and half years where a debt-free edifice was erected. In December 2007, she was appointed to Greater St. Mark Thornton by The Right Reverend Richard A. Chappelle. Once again, God honored her and the members to build Him a new edifice. Currently, she is completing her fifth year as shepherd of St. Andrew Pine Bluff, as assigned by The Right Reverend Michael L. Mitchell. Rev. Highsmith is a graduate of Fordyce High School, graduating in the top percentile and the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff (summa cum laude) with a Bachelor of Science degree. She has been employed with the Fordyce School District forty-one years. Presently, she is the receptionist/purchasing agent in the administration office.

Pastor Cheryle is the mother of four children and seven grandchildren.

Starting his senior year of high school, Reverend Jones began serving his country in the United States Army National Guard for a total of 5 years and was discharged honorably.



Through an inspiring dream and confirmation, in 2014 Rev. Jones became a member of the A.M.E. Church by joining Bethel A.M.E. Church located in North Little Rock, AR where he served proudly under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Tyrone A. Broomfield. Rev. Jones is a catalyst for positive change through his dedication to teaching the scriptures and working for kingdom building, working with the homeless, youth, young adults, and elderly.

Enjoying the life of an AME, Rev. Jones found his way to make a difference in the 12th Episcopal District by joining the ministry. With a passion for young adults, Rev. Jones sought to grow the young adult ministry known as the Richard Allen Young Adult Council. As a result of Rev. Jeremy Jones leadership in ministry, he received the God's Man of Standard Man of The Year Award from Dare to be Different Ministries under the leadership of Elder Deon White.

Rev. Jones has a strong passion and desire for evangelism. He proclaims Matthew 20:28 is a key to reaching lost souls his ultimate desire is for God's people to embrace the love of Christ and walk in power and victory while experiencing the promises of God. 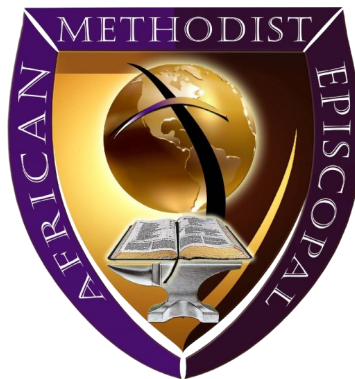
