

As he began his ministry, he enrolled in seminary. He then earned the Master of Divinity and Master of Theology from Candler School of Theology at Emory University in Atlanta, GA. Rev. Clayborn also served as an adjunct instructor in the Philosophy and Religion Department of Spelman College. While in seminary, Rev. Clayborn met and married his wife Rev. Sheri Smith Clayborn.

Rev. Clayborn also pursued an academic ministry. He went to Drew University in Madison, NJ, and earned the Master of Philosophy and the PhD in Liturgical Studies with a focus on Homiletics. He also served as an adjunct Homiletics instructor at New Brunswick Theological Seminary in New Brunswick, NJ, and served as a Religion Instructor at St. James Preparatory School in Newark, NJ. Rev. Clayborn also taught at Methodist Theological School in Ohio as an Assistant Professor of Homiletics. He then returned to New Jersey and was the Assistant Professor of Homiletics at The Theological School of Drew University in Madison, NJ. Rev. Clayborn assumed his first pastoral assignment at St. John AME Church in Huntsville, AL. and has been the proud pastor of Bethel AME Church of Baltimore, MD since September of 2016. He serves on various city and community boards, as well as leadership committees for the AME Church in the 2nd Episcopal District.

One of his favorite roles is that of proud father to Patrick, II –affectionately known as "P2" and Joya, who is the epitome of her name. Alongside his wife and best friend, Rev. Sheri and their loving family, the other things that bring him joy include, serving his church, empowering his community, and being a child of God.

THE REVEREND HARVEY G. POTTS, SR. was born in Lawton, Oklahoma on October 4, 1945. He graduated from Lawton Douglass High School and enrolled in Cameron College, Lawton, Oklahoma. Prior to graduation he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps serving as a Personnel Administration Specialist. Upon completion of two years military service he returned to Cameron College and worked part time until graduating in 1972. He continued his education at Southwestern Oklahoma State University, Wetherford, OK completing 28 hours towards a Masters Degree in Education. During that same time he graduated from the University of Oklahoma with a Master of Social Work Degree (MSW) in 1979. Reverend Potts served in Lawton, OK as Activities Director, Lawton Boys Club, City of Lawton, Assistant Recreation Director with duties as Director of the Patterson Community Center, Lawton Public Schools as Visiting

Teacher in the Elementary Schools, Xerox Corporation as a Sales Representative. Reverend Potts served in the Oklahoma State Department of Mental Health, Taliaferro Community Mental Health Center as a Social Worker. In 1979 Reverend Potts joined the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center, Oklahoma City, OK where he was employed in the Social Work Department. He has been a Licensed Clinical Social Worker, (LCSW) since 1981. He served in several assignments during his career with the VA. He served as Hospice Coordinator, Respite Coordinator, EEO Official, Consultant to the Vet Center Clinical Program, Black Program Manager, Acting Coordinator, Hospital Based Home Care Program (HBHC) and was named Employee of the Year in 1988. Reverend Potts retired from the VA in 2008 after 33 years of service. Reverend Potts is a member of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. He was ordained a Deacon in 1985 and ordained as an Elder in 1986 by Bishop H. Hartford Brookins. Reverend Potts has served as a pastor of the following churches: Robinson Chapel, Guthrie, OK; Forrest Hill, Oklahoma City, OK; Assistant to the Pastor, Avery Chapel, Oklahoma City, OK; St. Paul, Frederick, OK, Bethel, Shawnee, OK; Sherman Chapel, Spencer, OK. He was appointed Presiding Elder, Lawton District, in 1996. He was appointed Presiding Elder, Oklahoma City District in 1999. He served as Pastor of the Allen Chapel A.M.E. Church from 2006 to 2014. On November 1, 2014, Bishop Samuel Lawrence Green, Sr., appointed him Presiding Elder, in the Oklahoma State Annual Conference, A.M.E. Church, Western District where he currently serves. His fathers in the ministry Reverend Dr. N.C. Irving (mother Virgina) and Reverend Dr. Leroy Bailey Quinn were and continue to be a source of inspiration. He has served as a delegate to the General Conference, Member of the Episcopal Committee, Shorter College, Trustee Board, Oklahoma State Annual Conference Trustee and Finance Committee. Rev. Potts has been married to Berta Beatryce Phipps-Potts for 45 years. They have four children and seven grandchildren and count it all joy to be able to serve their church and community.

BISHOP KENNETH L. ROBINSON, SR. was born the 26th day of July in North Little Rock, Arkansas, to Pastor Emeritus Ulysses and the late Lady Lee Ella Robinson Jr. He is known as a dynamic pastor, teacher, preacher, trailblazer, mentor, singer, and multi-talented musician. Bishop Robinson is the husband of Prophetess Brenda Armstrong Robinson, and father of Roderick, Kenbria (Kendall), and Kenneth, Jr. and the Grandfather of Karis, Kendall Jr. and Kenneth III.

Submitting to the will of God in 1971, he was baptized, and six years later he accepted his call into the ministry. At the age of eleven, Bishop Robinson preached his first sermon titled "When I Met Jesus". He was licensed and ordained in May 1979. At the age of 18, he was led to his first full-time pastoral assignment at the St. Stephens Baptist Church of Scott, AR. In December 1988, Bishop Robinson became the shepherd of the Antioch Missionary Baptist Church of College Station, AR; which is now known as the Antioch Full Gospel Baptist Church, one Church in two locations (College Station and North Little Rock, AR.) He is a respected world class leader, visionary, and beloved friend to many. He is truly a great inspirational leader. During Bishop Robinson's tenure as pastor, several ministries, such as radio and television broadcasts have been introduced to the church.

Because he is a man with a God-given mission for ministering to the whole man, spirit, mind, and body, Bishop Robinson also enjoys ministering as a Gospel Radio Announcer and CEO and founder of Robinson Mortuary in three locations North Little Rock, Little Rock, and South Little Rock where their motto is "A Service You Can Trust".

God began to instruct Bishop Robinson to take his people to a higher level. During this time, he accepted the challenging task of taking a stand with the Full Gospel Baptist Church Fellowship. Consequently, a number of friends were lost because of this mighty move; however, a new milestone was evident when Pastor Robinson was consecrated as Bishop of the Full Gospel Baptist Church Fellowship Mid-Southern Region on November 2, 1993. At the time of his consecration, he was one of the nation's youngest, as well as the fourth Bishop to be consecrated under the umbrella of the Full Gospel Baptist Church Fellowship. Bishop Robinson was later appointed as the International Bishop of Music for the fellowship. In July, 2006 Bishop Robinson was elevated to Regional Bishop of the Northeast Central Region. Under the leadership of Bishop Robinson, The North East Central Region was awarded the Presiding Bishop Integrity Region of the Year Award in 2013, 2014, & 2018.

In 2008, Bishop Robinson crossed denominational barriers, by became chairman of The Arkansas Gathering the vision of this summit is to bring churches of different denominations together first, for the purpose of lifting Christ and secondly to impact the state of Arkansas through unity. The Arkansas Gathering, a Christian Movement's sole purpose was to promote unity among the Pastors and churches of our state by connecting ministries, collaborating efforts, and carrying out the great commission of Jesus Christ. On June 9, 2013, Bishop Robinson received his Doctorate of Theology in Religious Education from the Gospel Outreach Theological Institute of Houston, TX; also in 2013 Bishop founded U1C (Unity 1 Connection) U1C consisted of Bishop and all of his Spiritual Sons which promoted collaboration, instruction, and unity. In 2015, Bishop established BKLR Quartet Convention which is designed to reset the mindset by exploring, exposure, and exhortation of God's Word through Quartet Music.

In 2017, Bishop Robinson was presented the Harvey Watkins Sr. Award by Exclesisa Showcase Extravaganza 2017. Bishop Robinson also received, The Music Love Awards for "Icon of the Year Award" on August 24, 2018 presented by Angelica Records, Golden Triangle Music Awards awarded Bishop Robinson with "Our Pastor Rocks Award" on March 10, 2018 and Philander Smith College awarded Bishop Robinson with "Living Legend Award" on February 22, 2018; it was truly honor! Bishop Robinson also received The Church of God in Christ, Inc. Men Perfecting Men "2019 MPM Honors Award "on May 1, 2019, which is an award honoring Ecumenical Faith-Based Leaders. Truly God is continuing to work throughout the life and ministry of Bishop Kenneth L. Robinson, Sr. He is indeed anointed and appointed for such a time as this.

BISHOP HARRY L. SEAWRIGHT, the 133rd Elected and Consecrated Bishop in the African Methodist Episcopal Church, is the Presiding Prelate of the Ninth Episcopal District which encompasses the State of Alabama with the following Annual Conferences: Alabama River Region, Northwest Alabama, Southeast Alabama, Northeast Alabama, and Southwest Alabama. In July 2016, during the 50th Quadrennial Session of the AME Church General Conference in Philadelphia, PA, Bishop Seawright's election marked only the second time in AME history that a bishop was elected on the first ballot.

Bishop Seawright was born in Swansea, SC, to the late Joe Nathan and Mary L. Seawright. As a fourth-generation AME his faith was nurtured at Prodigal AME Church in Swansea, SC.

The late Bishop Frank M. Reid, II admitted Bishop Seawright to the South Carolina Central Annual Conference. The late Bishop Henry W. Murph

ordained him an Itinerant Deacon in the Washington Annual Conference. The late Bishop John Hurst Adams ordained him an Itinerant Elder in the Washington Annual Conference.

Bishop Seawright earned his Bachelor's degree in Business Administration from Benedict College, Columbia, SC; Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry degrees from Howard University School of Divinity, Washington, DC. Bishop Seawright founded and maintains many business interests. With his appointment as Interim Pastor of St. Stephen AME, St. Matthews, SC., Bishop Seawright's preparation for pastoral ministry began. He served on the ministerial staffs of Reid Temple AME and Pilgrim AME, both in Washington, DC. His pastoral appointments were: Payne Memorial AME, Jessup, MD; Hemingway Temple AME, Washington, DC; and Union Bethel AME, Brandywine and Temple Hills, MD. He served Union Bethel for 30 years, the longest tenure of any pastor in the church's 130-year history.

On the Connectional level, Bishop Seawright serves as chair of the AME International Commission on Economic Development and the International Health Commission. In Alabama, he has served as a board member on the Ingram State Technical College Foundation, and has been honored by Alabama A & M University. The Birmingham NAACP recognized him as the 2017 Distinguished Religious Leader of the Year. In 2018 he was inducted into Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity. He also serves as a Board Member of the Interdenominational Theological Center; and in 2018 he was appointed as 2nd Vice President of the Trustee Board of Turner Seminary in Atlanta, GA. From June 2019 until June 2020, Bishop Seawright served as the President of the Council of Bishops of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. On October 9, 2020, the State of Alabama, Jefferson County Sheriff's Commission deputized Bishop Harry L. Seawright to serve as a Special Deputy in Jefferson County. The Greater Titusville Civitan Club presented Bishop Seawright the 2021 Clergy Appreciation award in April 2021. Most recently, in April 2021, Bishop Seawright was appointed to serve on the newly created AstraZeneca US Health Equity Advisory Council (HEAC). Several cities in the State of Alabama have given him keys to their cities; and he is the recipient of several Congressional citations. Bishop Seawright continues to use his business acumen to benefit the Ninth Episcopal District.

Bishop Seawright is married to the Reverend Sherita Moon Seawright. They are the parents of Shari Nicole and Harry Matthew and the grandparents of Cameron Isaiah.


